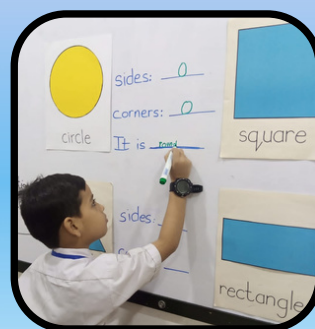


Activity-Based Learning:

Solidarity with Palestine:

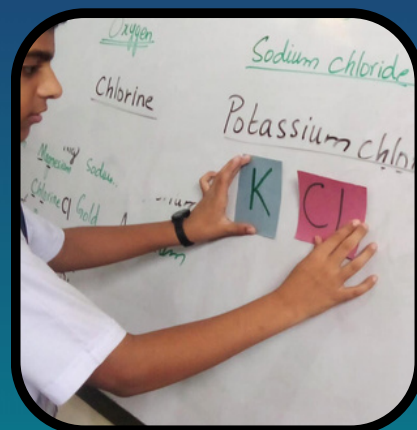

ICATS SCIENCE:

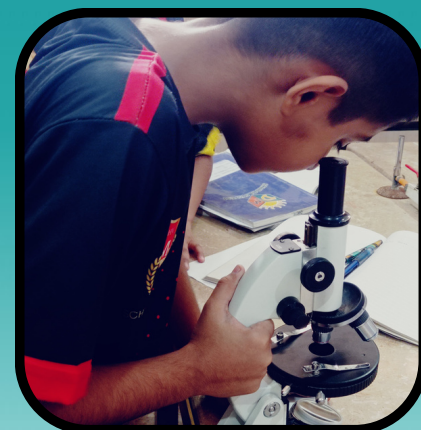
